SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1. Description of First-aid Measures

5.1. Extinguishing Media

6.3. Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up

For Containment: Remove ignition sources. Do not touch or walk on the spilled product. As an immediate precautionary measure, isolate spill or leak area in all directions. For large spills, confine the spill in a dike and charge it with wet sand or earth for subsequent safe disposal.

Methods for Cleaning Up: Clean up spills immediately and dispose of waste safely. Use only non-sparking tools. Absorb and/or contain spill with inert material. Do not take up in combustible material such as: saw dust or cellulosic material. Transfer spilled material to a suitable container for disposal. Contact competent authorities after a spill.

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8.2. Exposure Controls


